Canadian Red Cross Instructor Recertification Course Information Sheet

Course Cost: \$125.00

Pre-requisites: **FAIR:** You must have taught three courses during the two year certification period; at least one must be a Standard First Aid (SFA).

CPRIR: You must have taught three CPR courses during the two year certification period; at least one of the three courses must be a CPR Level C.

FAIR/CPRIR: You must also have a current instructor award or be in the three year grace period. The Canadian Red Cross must approve every student for registration in this course.

The instructor recertification course begins with a test of your Red Cross Standard First Aid and/or CPR C skills. If you do not pass this skills test you will not be able to continue in the recertification course. Note that you must demonstrate **Red Cross** skills even though your skills and protocols may be at a different level.

How to Register: Submit the enclosed Application with payment in full and include a photocopy of your instructor certificate. You are not confirmed until we have received payment in full and your Application has been approved.

Payment: Payment is at least 3 weeks in advance by Visa, debit card, cheque or cash.

Cancellation Policy: Cancellations made 20 business days prior to the course will be fully reimbursed upon receipt of written notification and providing any course materials in your possession are returned in new condition. Refunds will not be provided for cancellations made less than 20 business days prior to the course. If you fail to achieve instructional competency at the end of the course or are dismissed with just cause from the class no refund will be given.

The Fundamental Principles of the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement

Humanity

The International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement, born of a desire to bring assistance without discrimination to the wounded on the battlefield, endeavours, in its international and national capacity, to prevent and alleviate human suffering wherever it may be found. Its purpose is to protect life and health and ensure respect for the human being. It promotes mutual understanding, friendship, co-operation and lasting peace amongst all peoples.

Impartiality

It makes no discrimination as to nationality, race, religious beliefs, class or political opinions. It endeavours to relieve the suffering of individuals, being guided solely by their needs, and to give priority to the most urgent cases of distress.

Neutrality

In order to continue to enjoy the confidence of all, the Movement may not take sides in hostilities or engage at any time in controversies of a political, racial, religious or ideological nature.

Independence

The Movement is independent. The National Societies, while auxiliaries in the humanitarian services of their governments and subject to the laws of their respective countries, must always maintain their autonomy so that they may be able to act, at all times, in accordance with the principles of the Movement.

Voluntary Service

It is voluntary relief movement, not prompted in any manner by desire for gain.

Unity

There can be only one Red Cross or one Red Crescent Society in any one country. It must be open to all. It must carry on its humanitarian work throughout its territory.

Universality

The International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement, in which all societies have equal status and share equal responsibilities and duties in helping each other, is worldwide.

In keeping with the Fundamental Principles of the Red Cross, the Society is committed to social justice in the elimination of society structures and actions that oppress, exclude, limit or discriminate on the basis of race, gender, ethnicity, financial ability, sexual orientation, religion, disability or age.
