



Canadian Red Cross Instructor Course Information Sheet

Certified Red Cross instructors may teach a number of courses including Standard First Aid, Emergency First Aid, Marine First Aid, Child Care First Aid and CPR/AED programs. Your up-to-date FAI award is one pre-requisite needed to register as a First Responder and Oxygen Therapy Instructor or Wilderness & Remote First Aid Instructor.

Course Cost: \$800.

Pre-requisites: Refer to the Application Form for the list of pre-requisites.

The instructor course includes a test of your Red Cross Standard First Aid skills. If you do not pass this skills test you will not be able to continue in the instructor course. Note that you must demonstrate **Red Cross** skills even though your skills and protocols may be at a different level.

If you have applied for this course using an equivalent to the Red Cross SFA you will need to purchase a Student Manual and a CPR booklet. In addition, we strongly recommend that you audit the SFA course before committing to the Instructor program.

Co-teach: Following the 36 hour instructor course you will need to do a 16 hour co-teach to be completed within 6 months. You must have a sponsoring agency beforehand who has agreed to assist you with your co-teach requirements. It is your responsibility to find a course to co-teach.

How to Register: Submit the attached Application with payment in full and include a photocopy of your first aid certificates and ID as outlined in the Application Form. You are not confirmed until we have received payment in full and your Application has been approved.

Payment: At least 30 days in advance by Visa, debit card, cheque or cash.

Cancellation Policy: Cancellations made 20 business days or more prior to the course will be fully reimbursed upon receipt of written notification and providing any course materials you have are returned in new and unused condition. Refunds may not be provided for cancellations made less than 20 business days prior to the course. If you fail to achieve instructional competency at the end of the course or are dismissed with just cause from the class no refund will be given.

Come Prepared: Review all your course materials and bring them with you to class along with a pen, paper, barrier device and a pair of gloves. Candidates are expected to demonstrate competency by using the barrier device in their skills demonstration.

The Fundamental Principles of the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement

Humanity

The International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement, born of a desire to bring assistance without discrimination to the wounded on the battlefield, endeavours, in its international and national capacity, to prevent and alleviate human suffering wherever it may be found. Its purpose is to protect life and health and ensure respect for the human being. It promotes mutual understanding, friendship, co-operation and lasting peace amongst all peoples.

Impartiality

It makes no discrimination as to nationality, race, religious beliefs, class or political opinions. It endeavours to relieve the suffering of individuals, being guided solely by their needs, and to give priority to the most urgent cases of distress.

Neutrality

In order to continue to enjoy the confidence of all, the Movement may not take sides in hostilities or engage at any time in controversies of a political, racial, religious or ideological nature.

Independence

The Movement is independent. The National Societies, while auxiliaries in the humanitarian services of their governments and subject to the laws of their respective countries, must always maintain their autonomy so that they may be able to act, at all times, in accordance with the principles of the Movement.

Voluntary Service

It is voluntary relief movement, not prompted in any manner by desire for gain.

Unity

There can be only one Red Cross or one Red Crescent Society in any one country. It must be open to all. It must carry on its humanitarian work throughout its territory.

Universality

The International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement, in which all societies have equal status and share equal responsibilities and duties in helping each other, is worldwide.

In keeping with the Fundamental Principles of the Red Cross, the Society is committed to social justice in the elimination of society structures and actions that oppress, exclude, limit or discriminate on the basis of race, gender, ethnicity, financial ability, sexual orientation, religion, disability or age.
